



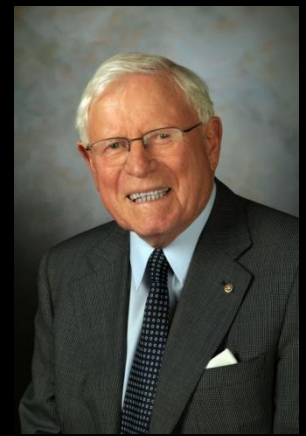

The Purpose

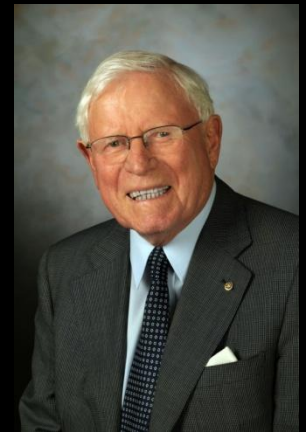
